death, we lost a tzaddik and anav, a masmid b'Torah, an oheiv Yisroel and rav tzedakos, a remnant of an earlier generation.

The Admur was born in Poland. His father passed away when he was five. In his youth he studied diligently in the Nevardok yeshiva in Mezritch. During the outbreak of World War II, he wandered from place to place until he ended up in the labor camps in Siberia, where he suffered greatly.

After the war, Rabbi Turenheim emigrated to Brazil as the Rebbe Rayatz advised him, where he served as a rav in Rio de Janeiro. He established Torah classes. and was involved in disseminating Torah with the encouragement of the Rebbe Rayatz.

Rabbi Turenheim moved to Eretz Yisroel fifteen years ago, and shortly thereafter established his beis midrash in Bnei Brak. He chose the northern part of the city, a spiritually desolate area, which subsequently became a makom Torah. Rabbi Turenheim davened mostly in the Chabad shul on Rechov Rashi. He was known as a true oheiv Yisroel and a great baal tzedaka. He supported mosdos of Torah and Chassidus, including Tiferes Moshe Betzalel in Ramot, and Nezer Yisroel in Rishon L'Tziyon.

The Admur would attend Chabad events and farbrengens in Bnei Brak, and one of his final appearances was at the huge Lag B'Omer parade, when he blessed the children with Birkas Kohanim.

On Friday night, Rabbi Turenheim davened in his beis midrash and wished

"Good Shabbos" to everybody there. After immersing in the mikva on Shabbos morning, he came home for his tallis before heading for shul. Unpredictably, he asked to rest a little, and suddenly passed away. His funeral was on Motzaei Shabbos. May his work in spreading Yiddishkeit, Torah and Chassidus as the shliach of the Rebbeim be a merit and an advocate for him.

After early Shabbos morning shiurim and davening, Rabbi Samuels spoke after krias ha'Torah. In his address to the crowd, he mentioned that the Shabbaton demonstrated the love of Chassidim for each other, expressed at this location where everyone gathered in order to share meals, learn, and farbreng together.

At 4:30 p.m., a unique segment of the program was presented by two talented speakers from very different backgrounds. The first speaker was Dr. Yaakov Moshe Moses, a baal teshuva from Cincinnati. He told his personal story about how shliach Rabbi Kalmanson was mekarev him. In return, he travels from one university to another to demonstrate to the students that the Torah has always been thousands of years ahead of science.

He also spoke about genetic cloning, connecting that to *t'chiyas ha'meisim*. He presented the Torah viewpoint concerning evolution, as well. He noted that researchers at the University of Cincinnati, along with

The children did so and continued to accompany the Rebbe towards 770.

Chassidim are always united. Sometimes this gets covered over and then suddenly, in front of the Rebbe, faced by the truth, the truth is revealed. We must remember what we truly think in our hearts about our brothers and sisters. If we succeed in revealing this inner feeling, we will be able to improve our behavior to each other.

After Mincha, everybody sat down to sing niggunim and learn Chassidus. There was barely any time to rest between the shiurim, the davening, meals, lectures, and farbrengens. 

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SUCCESSFUL KINUS OF BACHURIM-SHLUCHIM TO ERETZ YISROEL IN TZFAS

Motzaei Shabbos Parshas BaMidbar concluded a highly successful and uplifting Kinus HaShluchim for the shluchim in Yeshivas in Eretz Yisroel. The shluchim were sent this year from Oholei Torah, Morristown and Montreal and are in Kfar Chabad, Toras Emes (Yerushalayim), Bnei Brak, and Tzfas. The kinus was hosted by the Tzfas shluchim and was planned for Shabbos BaMidbar to coincide with Shabbos Achdus.

The shluchim arrived in Tzfas on Friday, and upon arrival had the opportunity to go to the Arizal's mikva and visit the various kivrei tzaddikim in the area. After an official picture was taken with all the kvutzos together, they took a walking tour in Tzfas to the shuls of the Arizal, Alshich, Reb Yosef Karo, and the famous Abuhav Shul, named after the Spanish Kabbalist, Rav Yitzchak Abuhav. The legend is that the shul "flew" to Tzfas from Spain after his passing.

The shluchim then davened Mincha and Kabbalas Shabbos in the yeshiva gedola zal. The Tzfas yeshiva is Chabad's biggest in the world (250 talmidim), and you can imagine the lebedikeit in the singing and dancing l'chavod the shluchim that Shabbos!

The shluchim ate the seudos Shabbos in the yeshiva dining room together with the bachurim.
